SAFE is a private, non-profit agency serving domestic/dating violence survivors and their children in Tangipahoa, Livingston, St. Helena and Washington Parishes for over 30 years. Professional staff help bridge the gap between victimization and independence. That includes everything from safety planning in order to remain in your home to emergency shelter and transitioning to a new life. Our services are confidential and driven by the identified needs of the victim.

SAFE provides 24-hour crisis intervention in Tangipahoa, Livingston and St. Helena Parishes, as well as transitional housing in Washington Parish.

SAFE offers advocacy and referral services to adults who self-identify as being victims of domestic violence and their dependent children. The agency provides an array of services, including crisis intervention, safety planning, individual/group counseling, emergency food, clothing, temporary lodging, transitional housing, transportation, legal advocacy/support, court technical assistance, court preparation and court accompaniment. SAFE also collaborates with and offers domestic violence training to law enforcement, local court systems and other social service agencies to ensure that quality services are being provided to victims of domestic violence and their dependent children.
